
2013 Knowledge-Based Audits™ of Housing and Urban Development (12/20/13) for Knowledge Coach



Welcome to the latest version of *2013 Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development (12/20/13)*, the latest title available in the ProSystem *f*[®] Knowledge Coach series! Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development Programs is designed to help the auditor efficiently and effectively perform audits of housing and urban development programs in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAS), Government Auditing Standards (GAGAS), and the Consolidated Audit Guide to Audits of HUD Programs (HUD Audit Guide), published by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The knowledge-based audit is a risk-based methodology that emphasizes using knowledge of the programs to make risk assessments in connection with the financial statement and compliance audit of a HUD program. This allows the auditor to more appropriately focus audit efforts on those areas which in the auditor's judgment are the most significant and pose the most risk to the audit. The administration of HUD programs includes both financial statement and compliance for audits of programs identified under Chapter 3, HUD Multifamily Housing Programs. Conducting audits of HUD programs requires the exercise of the auditor's professional judgment and a knowledge of the requirements of the HUD Audit Guide. This document is published for the purpose of communicating, to users of the toolset, updates and enhancements included in the current version. This document is not, and should not be used as, an audit program to update the audit documentation of an engagement started in a previous version of this product.

This is the forth update to this Knowledge Coach title. If you are updating from a previous version of this title refer to the Knowledge Coach User Guide Chapter 12. The guide is found on the Engagement File Room Help menu.

The 2013 documents include Accounting Research Material links to specific guidance that provides instant access to detailed analysis related to the steps and processes discussed in the workpapers.

WORKPAPER NOTES

Important Note for Customers updating binders from 2012 Clarified Knowledge Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development

You must install Engagement 6.11 and Knowledge Coach 1.11 before updating to the 2013 Knowledge Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development. Engagement 6.11 and Knowledge Coach 1.11 are required to use the 2013 Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development. You must also install the Engagement 6.11 Knowledge Coach 1.11 February Update before you download and install this Knowledge Coach title. For Knowledge Coach 1.11, this update fixes issues that occur when copying Knowledge Coach workpapers from a binder located in one bin into a binder that is located in another bin. It also fixes an issue where certain binders created in an Engagement version prior to 6.8 will not retain all selected answers when updating to the new clarified title versions. General Roll Forward Note:

You must be the current editor of all Knowledge Coach workpapers to update to the latest content during roll forward, and you must be the current editor upon opening the updated workpaper for the first time to ensure you see the updated workpaper. The **2013 Knowledge-Based Audits** of **Housing and Urban Development Programs** has been updated to help auditors conduct audit engagements in accordance with the clarified and redrafted auditing standards resulting from the ASB's Clarity Project and related

guidance, and is current through SAS-127, *Omnibus Statement on Auditing Standards*—2013. Many new tips and examples have been incorporated. The 2013 tools include links to specific guidance that provides instant access to detailed analysis related to the steps and processes discussed in the workpapers. Also included are revised financial statement disclosures checklists that provide a centralized resource of the required and recommended U. S. GAAP disclosures and key presentation items currently in effect, using the style referencing under the FASB Accounting Standards CodificationTM.

Additional Information on Knowledge Coach and the KBA Methodology

Knowledge-Based Audit (KBA) Methodology - Allows the results of one set of procedures to become the input for the next. The key components of the KBA methodology include:

- An **Overview** that guides auditors through the methodology;
- Knowledge-Based Audit documents, integral to the risk assessment and overall audit processes, which contain steps and procedures required by U.S. GAAS, GAGAS, and the HUD Audit Guide;
- Customizable Audit Programs that take auditors through related steps and procedures;
- **Practice Aids** to help auditors complete steps or processes outlined in the Knowledge-Based Audit documents and Audit Programs;
- Auditor's Reports that provide a variety of sample auditor's opinions on audited financial statements and compliance with HUD programs; and
- **Correspondence** documents that provide sample letters to be used to comply with U.S. GAAS, GAGAS, and the *HUD Audit Guide* requirements and in many other common situations.

The AICPA's Auditing Standards Board's (ASB) Risk Assessment Standards - The practice aids and tools in the 2013 Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development Programs are designed around the AICPA's risk assessment and clarified standards to assist auditors of Housing and Urban Development Programs by:

- Facilitating compliance with U.S. GAAS, GAGAS, and the HUD Audit Guide;
- Encouraging more effective audits through tailored audit programs and comprehensive practice aids;
- Helping auditors to focus on and respond to identified audit risks; and
- Enhancing audit documentation.

ProSystem fx® Knowledge Coach

ProSystem *A***® Knowledge Coach** functionality allows auditors to use the Knowledge-Based-Audit methodology more efficiently by eliminating the need for duplicate entry of the same information, tailoring audit documentation to each particular engagement, and documenting the link between risks identified and procedures performed. **AUD-100 Tailoring Question Workpaper** is a document in Knowledge Coach that presents engagement-level questions designed to aid in tailoring the engagement documentation to fit each client. Completing the questions helps the auditor avoid duplication and unnecessary workpapers.

Before you begin your audit, please review the guidance in **AUD-103 Overall Audit Program**. This workpaper is intended to be your road map through a Knowledge-Based Audit methodology. You should start your audit with **AUD-100 Tailoring Question Workpaper** and **AUD-103 Overall Audit Program**.

Risks can be captured via the Risk Summary task pane from any Knowledge Coach workpaper by the current editor of **KBA-502 Summary of Risk Assessments**. This allows the user to continuously assess risks during the engagement. Several workpapers prompt the consideration of the presence of risks, but the Risk Summary task pane must be used to document those risks. All documented risks flow to the Risk Summary. To ensure risks show in findings tables, make sure to check the "workpaper identified in" field of the Risk pane.

Information Flow helps cut down on the time spent duplicating information across forms. In addition, the flow of consistent information ensures that information and updates to information are not missed between workpapers. Drill-down functionality helps the user navigate quickly to the source of the information, aiding in the review of the audit file.

Diagnostics help keep track of unresolved issues like unanswered questions, incomplete risks, program steps not linked to risks or relevant assertions, missing workpaper, and more. Diagnostics now show when a form table has not been answered (i.e. tables in **KBA-101 Overall Audit Strategy** that are added by the tailoring questions in **AUD-100 Tailoring Question Workpaper**).

Links to Accounting Research Manager (ARM) - If you subscribe to an ARM library that includes audit content, you can now link directly to source material from Resources within Knowledge Coach documents. These links have been updated to reference to the accounting standards under the FASB Accounting Standards CodificationTM. Also, if you subscribe to the *Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Developemnt Guide* on ARM, you can take advantage of links to the audit guide material from within the Knowledge Coach documents.

Interpretive Guidance is integrated into each Knowledge Coach templates through the Tips view of each new task pane. Informational features include Practice Points, Examples, Optional Workpapers, and Resources to help auditors work more effectively and efficiently. We have also added the ability to navigate from Resources within a document or the tip pane directly to CCH's Accounting Research Manager and industry audit guides by simply clicking on the Reference.

Important Notes

- Make sure to save changes to workpapers before closing the workpaper or the binder to ensure data is correctly updated.
- If your Current Editor Knowledge Coach MS Word workpapers become read-only or crash, please do the following
 - Keep the binder with the affected workpapers open.
 - Contact Customer Service at 1-800-PFX-9998, option 4 to obtain a repair utility.
- Knowledge Coach cannot be used within the Shared File Room (SFR) feature of Engagement. However, Knowledge Coach workpapers can be shared across team members through check in, check out, workpaper assignment, syncing to the central file room and through peer-to-peer sync in the same way that other Engagement workpapers are shared.

System Requirements

- This title MUST be used with ProSystem *fx* Engagement version 6.11 and higher. If you are upgrading from ProSystem *fx* Engagement 6.0, 6.1, 6.1.2, 6.5, or 6.8 please contact Technical Support at 1-800-PFX-9998, option 4 for detailed instructions.
- A minimum of 4GB of RAM is required for optimal performance when opening and navigating through ProSystem *fx* Knowledge Coach documents.

Download Instructions

Download the 2013 Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development from the **ProSystem fx Knowledge Coach Updates** section of the ProSystem fx Engagement Support Web site at the following URL:

On some occasions the content package file (.KCP) has downloaded with the extension changed to .ZIP. If this occurs, please change the extension of the downloaded file to KCP using all capital letters.

Important: ProSystem *fx* Engagement version 6.11 or higher must be installed on the computer in order to install this Knowledge Coach title. Additional requirements include Microsoft Office 2007, Microsoft Office 2003 Primary Interop Assemblies (PIA) and Visual Studios 2005 Tools for Office Second Edition Runtime (VSTOR).

The following 2013 Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development (12/20/13).KCP download is a proprietary file that must be installed from within Engagement. Save this KCP file to a location on your local drive, extract it, and follow the Installation Instructions included in the Release Bulletin.

Installation Instructions

Once you have downloaded your Knowledge Coach title, you will need to add it to the list of titles within ProSystem fxEngagement. The only additional system requirement is approximately 75MB of disk space to store your Knowledge Coach program content files. Please refer to the ProSystem fx Engagement with Knowledge Coach Release Notes for any other system requirements.

After downloading the 2013 Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development titles, do the following:

 Launch the ProSystem fx Engagement Workpaper Management application so that the Local File Room is displayed. Select Tools > Knowledge Coach Titles.

The Knowledge Coach Titles window will be displayed.

- 2. Choose Add Title.
- 3. Browse to the title package file (*.KCP) that you previously downloaded and extracted from the ProSystem *fx* Knowledge Coach Support Web site.
- 4. Choose **Open**.

The system will display a progress indicator while the title package is added. You will receive a message that the title has been successfully installed once the process is complete.

Once the title is added, you must release it, so that other staff members in your firm can use it. You may also wish to "unrelease" previous versions of the title.

To unrelease a title:

- 1. Select a version of the KBA HUD title
- 2. Choose **Unrelease Title**. The date will be removed from the *Date released* column and staff that do not have the staff group property right to insert unreleased titles will not be able to insert the unreleased titles into a binder.

Note: You can determine this access in the **ProSystem** *fx* **Engagement Admin** module by selecting a staff group and choosing **File > Properties > Content** "Insert Knowledge Coach workpapers from unreleased titles" option

To release a title:

- 1. Select one of the Knowledge Coach titles in the list that has been added but is not yet released.
- 2. Choose **Release Title**. The current date and time will be displayed in the *Date released* column, and the status will change to "Released."

Note: You must add and assign a Knowledge Coach module as well as the Knowledge Tools title license in the ProSystem *fx* Engagement Administrator before using the workpapers.

Important: Once the 2013 Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development titles have been added and released, they will be automatically deployed to other staff members when they login to the "Office" location, or when they synchronize a binder that contains Knowledge Coach workpapers from this title.

Permission key files may be downloaded from our Web site at http://tax.cchgroup.com or when adding or updating the new licenses within ProSystem *fx* Engagement with Knowledge Coach version 6.11 and higher. After updating the license file in the ProSystem *fx* Engagement Admin module, licenses need to be assigned to the staff who will use 2013 *Knowledge-Based Audits of Housing and Urban Development*

Using Your Knowledge Coach Content




Figure 1 - New Knowledge Coach Workpaper

To use your Knowledge Coach Workpaper Templates, open a binder in ProSystem fx Engagement, select the workpaper tab into which you would like to insert the workpaper, and select **New Knowledge Coach Workpaper** from the toolbar or File menu. The New Knowledge Coach Workpaper dialog appears (*Figure 1*).

Select the New Knowledge Coach Title with the content you would like to use. You can only select titles you have installed. The information displayed changes to reflect the workpaper organization available for the selected title. Select the Knowledge Coach Workpaper Templates to insert into your binder and click OK. The Selected Workpaper Properties dialog appears. Each workpaper name is automatically loaded into the Name field. Add a workpaper index in the Index field and make any Name modifications you desire. You can also modify the tab location or the roll forward settings for each workpaper. Then click OK. The integrated Knowledge Coach workpaper is now inserted into your engagement binder.
